FACTSHEET 2020

-'SAWA 121' Social Media Application:

- Launched in December 2020 to provide psychosocial and legal counseling services for harassed women.
- Telehealth services available with the possibility to book an appointment with the e-doctor
- Quick access icons to contact the police or call an ambulance.
- Localization of places where harassment occurs and information-sharing with local authorities .
- Promotes free mobility and harassment-free and safe spaces by reclaiming the public sphere for girls and women.









- -32 new volunteers completed Sawa's 110-hour training on remote counseling at the Listening Center.
- -Trusted Partnership with Facebook to fight cyber harassment and cyberbullying.
- -42 workshops reaching 179 beneficiaries in 14 marginalized communities of the West Bank with the Mobile Clinic.
- -60 professionals from seven NGOs, the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Social Development received training on GBV and remote counseling.
- -76 computers, laptops, and tablets donated to female students to ease access to online education through the 'Education without Borders A Computer for Every Child' campaign .


Quotes From Beneficiaries:




Total Calls in 2020


-21% of all calls during the pandemic were answered during the night shift.
